Carta de Recomendación, del Director(a) de Formación de fe (DRE), Líder de Formación o Director(a) de la escuela, que diga que el solicitante tiene la experiencia como catequista. La carta debe ser dirigida a Aracely Alcalá, Especialista de Certificación.

**The Sacrament of Anointing of the Sick**, through the ministry of the priest, it is Jesus who touches the sick to heal them from sin – and sometimes even from physical ailment. The Rite of Anointing tells us there is no need to wait until a person is at the point of death to receive the Sacrament. A careful judgment about the serious nature of the illness is sufficient or impending surgery. When the Sacrament of Anointing of the Sick is given, the hoped-for effect is that, if it be God's will, the person be physically healed of illness. The primary effect of the Sacrament is a spiritual healing by which the sick person receives the Holy Spirit's gift of peace and courage to deal with the difficulties that accompany serious illness or the frailty of old age. If you have impending surgery, or have been recently diagnosed with a life threatening ailment, ask to be anointed.

## Freedom of Religion vs. Religious Indifferentism

This part of our Catholic faith is sometimes misunderstood. As Catholics, we believe in freedom of religion. That means that no one should be forced to become a member of any particular religion. To force someone to convert is to violate their dignity as a human being. But some people, and even some faithful Catholics, confuse freedom of religion with what the theologians call "religious indifferentism."

Religious indifferentism is the attitude that says all religions are the same, and so it doesn't really matter which one you believe in, as long as you are sincere. But it is not true that all religions are the same. Human nature is the same, and so the religious impulse that we all feel in the depths of our hearts is universal, present in every time, place, and culture. But different religions have different ways of dealing with that impulse. Satanists deal with it by worshipping the devil, even using human sacrifice sometimes. Buddhists deal with it by gradually detaching themselves from all activities of earthly life. And other religions deal with it in other ways. To say that all religions are basically the same is a lazy cop-out.

It also contradicts Christ's own message. He told the Apostles during the Last Supper, "I am the Way; I am Truth and Life. No one can come to the Father except through me" (John 14:6). And St Peter said the same thing in today's First Reading: "... there is no other name under heaven by which we are to be saved." Our job is not to try and figure out how God saves those who never hear the gospel or receive an invitation to join Christ's one flock. Rather, our job is to spread the gospel and gather the scattered sheep of the world into Christ's own Catholic Church.



## Libertad de religión frente al indiferentismo religioso

Esta parte de nuestra fe católica a veces se malinterpreta. Como católicos, creemos en la libertad de religión. Eso significa que nadie debe ser obligado a convertirse en miembro de ninguna religión en particular. Obligar a alguien a convertirse es violar su dignidad como ser humano. Pero algunas personas, e incluso algunos fieles católicos, confunden la libertad de religión con lo que los teólogos llaman "indiferentismo religioso".

El indiferentismo religioso es la actitud que dice que todas las religiones son iguales, por lo que realmente no importa en cuál creas, siempre que seas sincero. Pero no es cierto que todas las religiones sean iguales. La naturaleza humana es la misma, por lo que el impulso religioso que todos sentimos en el fondo de nuestro corazón es universal, presente en todos los tiempos, lugares y culturas. Pero las diferentes religiones tienen diferentes formas de lidiar con ese impulso. Los satanistas tratan con esto adorando al diablo, incluso usando sacrificios humanos a veces. Los budistas lo afrontan separándose gradualmente de todas las actividades de la vida terrenal. Y otras religiones lo tratan de otras formas. Decir que todas las religiones son básicamente iguales es una evasión perezosa.

También contradice el propio mensaje de Cristo. Les dijo a los Apóstoles durante la Última Cena: "Yo soy el Camino; Yo soy la Verdad y la Vida. Nadie puede venir al Padre si no es por mí" (Juan 14: 6). Y san Pedro dijo lo mismo en la primera lectura de hoy: "... no hay otro nombre bajo el cielo por el cual podamos ser salvos". Nuestro trabajo no es tratar de averiguar cómo Dios salva a aquellos que nunca escuchan el evangelio o reciben una invitación para unirse al único rebaño de Cristo. Más bien, nuestro trabajo es difundir el evangelio y reunir las ovejas esparcidas del mundo en la propia Iglesia Católica de Cristo.
