**The Sacrament of Anointing of the Sick**, through the ministry of the priest, it is Jesus who touches the sick to heal them from sin – and sometimes even from physical ailment. The Rite of Anointing tells us there is no need to wait until a person is at the point of death to receive the Sacrament. A careful judgment about the serious nature of the illness is sufficient or impending surgery. When the Sacrament of Anointing of the Sick is given, the hoped-for effect is that, if it be God's will, the person be physically healed of illness. The primary effect of the Sacrament is a spiritual healing by which the sick person receives the Holy Spirit's gift of peace and courage to deal with the difficulties that accompany serious illness or the frailty of old age. If you have impending surgery, or have been recently diagnosed with a life threatening ailment, ask to be anointed.

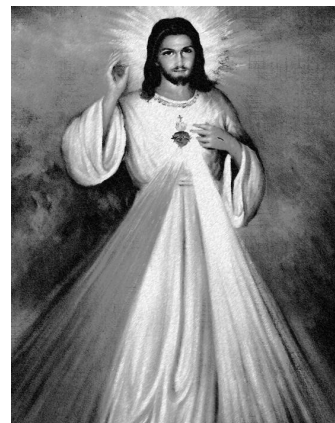

## The ABC's of Divine Mercy

We all need to be reminded of these difficult truths, because life in this world can get distracting. And the reminder he is giving us today will bear fruit in our lives if we follow the ABC's of the Divine Mercy.

A. Ask for mercy: The best way to ask for his mercy for ourselves is through the sacrament of confession, entrusted to the Church on this very day 2000 years ago.

Here is what Jesus told St Faustina about confession:

***When you approach the confessional, know this, that I Myself am waiting there for you. I am only hidden by the priest, but I Myself act in your soul. Here the misery of the soul meets the God of mercy. (Diary, 1602)***

But we can also ask for mercy for others, especially by praying for those who don't trust or believe in Christ's mercy.

B. Be merciful: Jesus told St Faustina,

***"I demand from you deeds of mercy... You are to show deeds of mercy to your neighbors always and everywhere."***

This means doing good things for others not because they deserve it or to get a reward, but simply in order to follow in the footsteps of our merciful Lord. But where can we find the strength to do that?

C. Completely trust in Jesus: Jesus himself will give us his grace, if we let him. He will make us into ambassadors of his mercy, just as he did with the first Apostles. Whenever we are afraid to ask for mercy, when we feel too weak to be merciful, we should simply pray the prayer that Jesus told St Faustina to write underneath the image of his Divine Mercy: *"Jesus, I trust in you."*

And let's start right now, during this Mass, when we receive the fountain of mercy himself in Holy Communion.

Nothing would please him more.

## El ABC de la Divina Misericordia

(Translated with Google translate)

Todos necesitamos que nos recuerden estas difíciles verdades, porque la vida en este mundo puede distraernos. Y el recordatorio que nos está dando hoy dará frutos en nuestras vidas si seguimos el ABC de la Divina Misericordia.

A. Pedir misericordia: La mejor manera de pedir su misericordia para nosotros es a través del sacramento de la confesión, confiado a la Iglesia en este mismo día hace 2000 años.

Esto es lo que Jesús le dijo a Santa Faustina sobre la confesión:

***Cuando te acerques al confesionario, debes saber esto, que Yo mismo te estoy esperando. Solo estoy escondido por el sacerdote, pero Yo mismo actúo en tu alma. Aquí la miseria del alma se encuentra con el Dios de la misericordia. (Diario, 1602)***

Pero también podemos pedir misericordia para los demás, especialmente orando por aquellos que no confían o no creen en la misericordia de Cristo.

B. Sed misericordiosos: Jesús le dijo a Santa Faustina:

***"Te exijo obras de misericordia ... Debes mostrar obras de misericordia a tu prójimo siempre y en todo lugar"***.

Esto significa hacer cosas buenas por los demás, no porque lo merezcan o para obtener una recompensa, sino simplemente para seguir los pasos de nuestro misericordioso Señor. Pero, ¿dónde podemos encontrar la fuerza para hacer eso?

C. Confiar plenamente en Jesús: Jesús mismo nos dará su gracia, si se lo permitimos. Nos convertirá en embajadores de su misericordia, como hizo con los primeros Apóstoles. Siempre que tengamos miedo de pedir misericordia, cuando nos sintamos demasiado débiles para ser misericordiosos, simplemente debemos rezar la oración que Jesús le dijo a santa Faustina que escribiera debajo de la imagen de su Divina Misericordia: ***"Jesús, en ti confío"***. Y comencemos ahora mismo, durante esta Misa, cuando recibamos la fuente de la misericordia él mismo en la Sagrada Comunión.

Nada le agradaría más.
